


FOOD SECURITY

Report for the Board May 19, 2021

PROVINCIAL & REGIONAL DATA

- Indigenous communities report 3-5X higher household food insecurity compared with general Canadian population (Pacific-Maritime region of BC) FNFNES Summary Report
- ❖ 10% of youth in South Vancouver Island report going to bed hungry some of the time & 1% often or always 2018 Adolescent Health Survey
- ❖ 12% of households in BC are food insecure—3% severe Household Food Insecurity in Canada 2018
- Throughout COVID, concern for food security is higher for families with children (14.3%) than those without (11.8%)—lower in the south Island than the rest of BC Speak Survey, May 2021

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

COVID SUPPORTS

Victoria Foundation grant—\$12,000—distributed to schools with high needs and to individual families (November—92 families March—115 families, June pending)

Additional grant funds—\$7500 (Victoria area community initiative)—June distribution for food cards and individual school supports

Support from Beacon Community Services—individual family support for food & housing & food card support (spring 2020)

District Support—Individual family support for meals & gift cards (spring 2020)

SCHOOL GARDENS

- 14 schools have food gardens or other food growing systems (e.g. greenhouse, in-class) supported largely by staff who are passionate in this area.
- Where possible some of this food is incorporated into school food programs.




MEAL & SNACK PROGRAMS

The following school meal programs are offered:

| Meal | 1-5 Days/Week |
|-----------|---------------|
| Breakfast | 11 schools |
| Lunch | 14 schools |
| Snacks | 14 schools |

- All schools offer some supplementary food programs (snacks, breakfast, lunch) which may also include school fruit and vegetable programs, cafeteria service, individual student support in designated classrooms, and school-based food growing programs.
- Schools work closely with parents and community resources to identify students-in-need.
- Saanich Schools support approximately 450 students-in-need across the district.
