The Board of Education is committed to engaging with its communities to develop the 2022-2027 Strategic Plan for Saanich Schools.

The specific goals and strategies that are central to the Strategic Plan will be shaped by the district's core values and beliefs, vision, philosophy, mission, and guiding principles, all of which create the framework for everything we do to support our learning community.



Strategic Plan 2022-2027 Focus Areas

1. Literacy

Rationale:

The correlation between student success and early literacy intervention is clear. It is essential that literacy instruction is prioritized.

2. Indigenous Learner Success

Rationale:

The Truth and Reconciliation Commission has called for us to recognize our moral imperative to have an educational system where we address achievement gaps for Indigenous students – to engage in educational practices where we protect the right to Indigenous languages, where students do not encounter barriers or systemic racism, and graduate with dignity, purpose and options.

3. Mental Health & Wellness

Rationale:

Schools are the first step in the pathway of care, and they support mental health promotion by building resilience, creating supportive learning environments, and addressing barriers to positive mental health and wellness.

4. Other Considerations

In the consultation process, we invited community members, parents/guardians, staff and students to offer insights and suggestions on other considerations for the Strategic Plan.

540 people responded to the survey.

Focus Area: Literacy

- Critical to focus on supporting literacy from Kindergarten to Grade 12
- Early intervention is also key
- More support for small group and one on one instruction
- Schools must cultivate a love of reading
- Success in literacy lays the foundation for students
- Focus on data and responding to it

"The first six years last forever."

"Text studies must reflect today's values. More effort should be made to find literature by women and BIPOC authors is critical."



Focus Area: Indigenous Learner Success

- Language is critical. SENĆOŦEN must be incorporated wherever possible
- Increase connections between schools, local communities and elders
- Increase staff support, in particular Indigenous EA support
- All staff must focus on belonging for Indigenous students
- Continue to focus on implementing the 94 calls to action
- Incorporate cultural activities into all schools

'All kids need tangible relationships with Indigenous communities."

"I see this as an opportunity for the Saanich School District to be a leader in incorporating Indigenous culture into the curriculum. Making Indigenous learning at school a top priority is paramount to reconciliation and rebuilding relationships between settlers and Indigenous communities."



Focus Area: Mental Health & Wellness

- Teach mental health literacy for students
- Early years are critical to lay foundation
- Consider staff wellness
- Increase staffing, in particular counsellors and YFCs
- Allow students to experience joy with extra-curricular activities and electives
- Focus on an anti-bullying strategy
- Reduce stigma and stereotypes

"I really want my kids to feel like they have a team behind them to support their emotional/social learning."

"Teach mental health in the same way as other subjects. Normalize the stigma."

Questions:

In summary, the questions were follow-ups on the main themes asked in the survey. For example:

- How can we ensure numeracy will be addressed?
- Can you expand literacy to include digital and media literacy?
- Where do teens go to get information on sexual health?
- I'd like to know about the district's commitment to and plan for the physical health of its students, teachers and staff?
- Do you have Indigenous people in Indigenous roles?
- Look at the systems in place. Are they culturally responsive and innovative?

The WSÁNEĆ Community Survey was made available for community members, parents/guardians, staff, and students.

341 responses were received, demonstrating significant community engagement.

The majority of respondents supported the three goals and offered many thoughtful suggestions regarding how the district could move forward. Other areas of focus were also suggested.

- The discussion notes provided more personal stories to themes based on their own child's experiences.
- Each of Literacy, Indigenous Learner Success and Mental Health & Wellness were reinforced in the comments.
- Particularly of importance was the identified need to address the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC) Calls to Action, building cultural capacity and trust, connection, sharing and communication with communities.



- Extra support in classes is needed





- Focus on an anti-bullying strategy


